
### **Lessons Learned**

- Based on the data, additional effort and partnerships specifically devoted to child hunger are needed.
- Higher needs exist in frontier parts of Kansas.
- Community pharmacists are critical to supporting member care, especially in frontier and rural areas.
- Provider education on Z-Code utilization will increase the ability to identify and assist with FI as well as other SDoH.
- Partnering with community organizations such as County Health Departments & Food Banks has allowed Aetna to be a part of giving food directly to those in need.

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### Issue

Food Insecurity (FI) is defined as a person or family's inability to access healthy food resources as well as uncertainty about the availability of adequate food resources. People who experience food insecurity often worry about a lack of resources to get adequate food and may skip meals or eat smaller portions so that other family members may eat.<sup>1,2</sup>

Although FI rates in Kansas have improved over the past several years (see line graph by top 10 counties), gaps remain. Data from Feeding America in 2020<sup>1</sup> (see Kansas map) shows that more than 40 counties in Kansas have an FI rate between 10.9% to 21.7%. In the map, darker colors represent counties with a greater FI score.

# **Project**

At Aetna Better Health of Kansas (ABH-KS), our approach to addressing food security is multifaceted, community-based and evolving. Components include:

- Data-driven partnerships with community organizations to ensure existing services and innovations are supported.
- Incentives for providers to report member's SDoH needs via ICD-10 Z-Codes.
- Collaboration with independent pharmacies to improve care and social supports through Care Management.
- A member webinar to help members make nutritious food choices.
  - Education on chronic disease management.
  - Contact info for Care Management & Member Services for assistance.
- A Food Insecurity Screening (FIS) via SMS or interactive voice response to identify members with FI and provide resource info and referrals. A follow up survey 3 months later ensures needs were met.


## Results

While some of these efforts are new and data is still being collected, initial results are positive:

- 2,825 families received food distribution support in 2021.
- 208 individuals were assessed for social needs by our community reported issues with food security, allowing our care teams to offer
- Pediatricians and family practitioners were identified as the provider types most likely to submit Z Codes.
- 59.5% of our members who have a Z-Code claim related to food insecurity are children 4 years old and younger
