Goal:

The goal at Project Firstline is to make sure you have the infection control knowledge that you need and deserve to keep yourself, your patients, your colleagues, and your family safe. To stop the spread of infectious disease threats—including COVID-19—anyone working in a healthcare facility needs a basic knowledge of infection control and must understand and be ready to use infection control processes and procedures throughout their workday, including during every patient care activity and healthcare interaction. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Project Firstline is a collaborative of diverse healthcare, public health, and academic partners that is working to provide engaging, innovative, and effective infection control training for millions of frontline U.S. health care workers as well as members of the public health workforce.
