Health Ambassador Training Facilitated By Johns Hopkins University Trust plays an integral part in ensuring delivery of person-centered quality care. During the COVID-19 pandemic, distrust of public health fueled vaccine hesitancy and created additional barriers to vaccine uptake. As trusted members of their communities, front line staff, residents and family members can serve as ideal messengers and conversation partners for vaccination decision-making. The John Hopkins team originally developed the Be REAL framework and training materials to prepare community health workers (CHWs) to work with vaccine-hesitant communities nationwide. They have now adapted this for use in the long-term care sector. Through the four steps of "Relate," "Explore," "Assist," and "Leave (the door open)," your trusted messengers will be taught to prioritize relationship building as a primary goal. In this shift from focusing on adherence to public health recommendations (e.g., get vaccinated) to building relationships, the value of vaccine uptake is secondary to the quality of the relationship being formed. The Be REAL framework helps staff to harness the power they already possess. The goal of the Be REAL framework is to foster true partnership between the staff and the residents/families.

- Side note: Patient influenza data is not entered into NHSN, it is pulled from MDS, ensure that accurate vaccination status entered into MDS by June 1, 2024 for all residents who spent 1 or more days in your facility between October 1 and March 31.
